### Shower House Cleaning

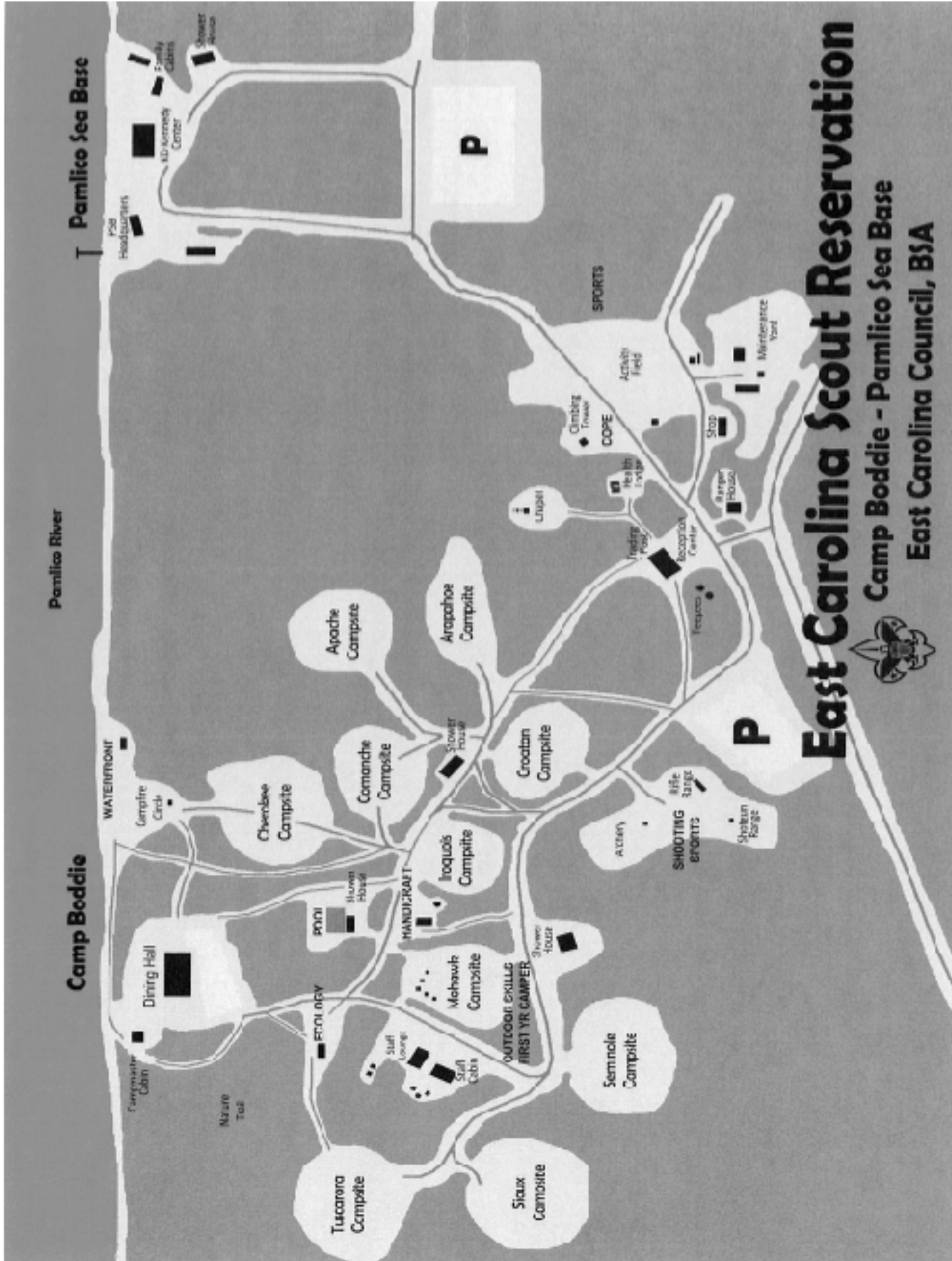

# Rules and Regulations

All Scouters are expected to follow the guidelines set forth in the Guide to Safe Scouting and the Scouter Code of Conduct.

1. After unloading, all vehicles should be moved to the designated parking area. This will help ensure the safety of all campers and reduce the chance of damage to a vehicle. Unit trailers will be allowed to remain in the campsite as long as they are detached from a vehicle and safely secured in-place.
2. No firearms or fireworks are allowed in camp.
3. Dress code during the day is Class "B" (t-shirt and shorts). All scouts are encouraged to wear Class "A" field uniforms to Saturday Night Campfire and Sunday Morning Worship Service.
4. Ground fires are allowed in camp but only in designated areas. An alternative is the use of a portable raised patio fire pit. Firefighting equipment consisting of one (1) water bucket, one (1) sand bucket and a dedicated shovel should be maintained at each campsite. All Scouters are encouraged to utilize "Leave No Trace" principles.
5. Low noise level practices are to be followed each evening after 10pm.
6. **All garbage removal is the responsibility of each unit.** Place all trash inside the dumpster near the dining hall. Please have departing adults do the responsible thing and place trash **INSIDE** the dumpsters. Trash left outside will not be picked up by the trash company.
7. Each unit is responsible for bringing their own food and potable water.
8. Wastewater should not be disposed of within 50 ft of a tent.
9. The registered Unit Leaders are responsible for their unit at all times. There must be two-deep leadership at all times. Each Cub Scout should be accompanied by a related adult at all times, or travel with two-deep leadership. Only family may sleep in the same tent with a youth member in accordance with the Guide to Safe Scouting and Youth Protection Policies.
10. Units and parents will be responsible for any medications for Scouts. Each unit should be equipped with an adequate first aid kit and must have current Annual Health and Medical forms with them for every participant including adults.
11. Adult leaders must support the attitude that we are better off without tobacco. Use of any tobacco products, including electronic cigarettes, within eyesight of youth is prohibited.
12. No fires, grills, fueled lanterns, or open flames are allowed in tents.
13. Closed toe shoes must be worn during all activity periods. This applies to adults and Scouts.
14. No alcoholic beverages are permitted at the event.
15. The buddy system is to be used at all times. No one should leave camp without the permission of his or her unit leader.
16. Prior to check out, all units should clear all equipment, trash, fire pits, and replace sod (if needed) in their campsites.
17. Any attendee violating these Rules and Regulations or acting in a manner inconsistent with the Policies and Principles of the Boy Scouts of America is subject to dismissal from the event with no additional notice and no refund of any fees.

## Arrival Procedures

Unit leaders can check in 4:00 pm - 5:00 pm. General check-in is from 5:00 pm - 8:00 pm. If arriving after 8 pm Friday evening, you can check in with your unit leader.

Each campsite will be granted 2-3 gate passes. Campers should drop gear and return vehicle to parking area quickly so the next person can get a pass. Pack may also combine gear into a truck or trailer to get the gear back to the site quicker. Vehicles are allowed to bring trailers and cookers to the sites but the vehicle counts as a vehicle and vehicles are not to be left at the sites. Please leave no trace at your campsite. **DO NOT DRIVE OR PARK ON THE GRASS.**

## **Departure Procedures**

8:15 am - 11:00 am Campsite Check-Out

After reveille, the gate will be opened and vehicles will be allowed in camp. Please be respectful and remain on the roads and do not drive deep into campsites. Please DO NOT PARK OR DRIVE ON THE GRASS. A Scout is Reverent. We encourage everyone to attend the Scout Sunday Service at the Chapel directly after reveille.
